Chapel Hill Public Library in Chapel Hill, NC, is presenting *Botanical Poetry, A Selection of Drawings from Finding Romanticism Among Grunge* by Evelyn Wong, as part of the Chapel Hill Public Arts Juried Exhibition Series, on view through Nov. 6, 2014. A reception will be held on Oct. 18, from 4 to 5:30pm.

Evelyn Wong is an artist from Columbia, SC, who enjoys studying the natural world and its place in our lives. This selection of drawings on view at the Chapel Hill Public Library is part of a larger ongoing series tells the stories of individual plants as they change and grow, often unnoticed in a world of technological noise and distractions until we find the need to escape and immerse ourselves and our senses in what nature has to offer.

As an artist whose childhood curiosity has never left, Wong spends many hours studying and observing the natural world outside of and within her home state of South Carolina. Her work is often influenced by the dream-like imagery of Post-Impressionist Art and the philosophies behind traditional Chinese watercolor paintings.

College in 2007, Wong received her BFA in Studio Arts with a concentration in both Drawing and Painting. She has exhibited as a featured artist at the First Thursdays on Main series in Columbia, SC, in 2009, 2012, and 2013, and she has been a demonstrator at the "Unearth" annual arts festival at Saluda Shoals Park in Columbia from 2009 to 2013. Additionally, Wong has won various awards at the South Carolina State Fair Fine Arts Exhibit in the Amateur Division, including 1st Place in Open Media in 2007 and Best of Show in 2010.

FRANK:inFocus: Engaging Light, has been made possible with support from the Orange County Arts Commission, a grassroots program of the North Carolina Arts Council.

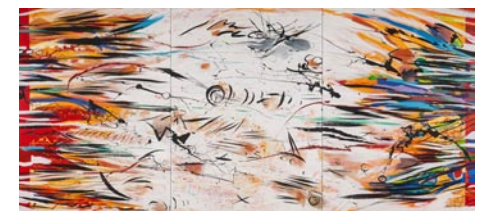

The Hillsborough Arts Council Gallery in Hillsborough, NC, will present *Energy Stream of Consciousness II-Energy Particle Volatility*, featuring works by Nancy Smart Carlson, on view from Oct. 31 through Nov. 22, 2014. A reception will be held on Oct. 31, from 6-9pm.

Carlson is triggered by high energy events. Through her active marks and dynamic style she captures the energy that is suggested by the particles of matter that one might see under a microscope. Imagination is the key. Capturing and painting is her response to the energy. This satisfies her need to be inspired and her will to stimulate others.

Carlson has a BFA from Oklahoma State University. She taught art in public school for 18 years and also at the Philbrook Museum of Art for five years. After retiring from teaching she managed the Foundations Gallery at Rodgers University. She is an accomplished multimedia artist who has participated in many notable

workshops including Penland, Arrowmont, Anderson Ranch Arts Center, Santa Fe University of Art and Design, and the Tulsa University Daniel Lang Montone Workshop in Umbria.
