## Burroughs-Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, SC, Features Works by Jonathan Green

The Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, SC, is presenting *Jonathan Green: Embracing Gullah Spirit*, on view through Dec. 31, 2022.

Jonathan Green is a beloved South Carolina native son and the preeminent artist of the Lowcountry's Gullah culture, a natural outgrowth of his childhood in the Gullah communities in the rural Southeast where descendants of West Africans preserved their linguistic and cultural traditions. With a body of work spanning four decades,

Green is considered to be one of the foremost American painters depicting the Southern experience.

The exhibition features 29 iconic paintings from the Museum's Permanent Collection, with additional works on loan from the Morris Museum of Art (Augusta, GA) and the McKissick Museum (Columbia, SC), as well as works on loan from a private collector.

Green is known for his exuberant portrayals of Southern and particularly Gullah

life, which feature brilliant colors, lush landscapes and simple acts of joy, whether dancing, fishing or walking on the beach. As well as a prolific creator, Greene is also a passionate advocate for the arts. As a collector, the artist, along with his partner Richard Weedman, have amassed a number of works by notable and emerging artists, many of them artists of color, most reflecting the themes of work, love, belonging and spirituality.

His association with the Art Museum dates back to a hugely popular 2003 exhibit, *Southern Images of Faith, Family and Friends*, and he has continued to be a favorite exhibitor with Museum audiences as well as collaborating in multiple educational and outreach projects. His 2021 book, *Gullah Spirit! The Art of Jonathan Green*, published by The University of South Carolina Press, is available at the Art Museum Shop.

Green's artistry extends far beyond the merely two-dimensional. His rich, vibrant colors were transformed into the backdrops and costumes for the 2016 Spoleto Festival production of *Porgy and Bess* and for Columbia City Ballet's production *Off the Wall and Onto the Stage: Dancing the Art of Jonathan Green*.

As well as the institutions noted above, Green's works are also included in the permanent collections of The Afro-American Museum of Philadelphia, The Naples Museum of Art (Naples, FL) and The IFCC

Cultural Center (Portland, OR). Green has received awards recognizing both his work and his civic contributions. In 1996, Green received an honorary doctorate from the University of South Carolina; in 2009, Green received the Key of Life Award for his contributions and achievements in the visual fine arts from the NAACP.

The Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum is a wholly nonprofit institution located on South Ocean Boulevard in Myrtle Beach.
