STARworks in Star, NC, will present its annual Holiday Ornament Sale, on Dec. 7, 2019, from 10am-4pm, featuring more than 2,500 colorful hand-crafted glass and ceramic ornaments. Ornaments are handcrafted by STARworks artists, interns and resident artists, and come in all sizes, shapes and colors.

STARworks Clay Studio artists have created ceramic crystalline ornaments in new colors this year. In addition to the familiar ball ornaments, STARworks glassblowers have brought back the popular star ornament in new colors for this holiday season, and plenty of candy canes and icicles.

The glass and ceramic artists at STARworks have also created ornaments and holiday items for the STARworks Signature Series. Glassblowers and clay artists create Signature Series items in their own time after work. These items are unique to each artist and in limited supply.

There are no advanced or reserved sales. Ornaments left after the sale will be available in the School House Gallery at STARworks, Monday through Saturday, from 9am to 5pm while supplies last. A limited selection of ornaments will be available online at

STARworks recommends people arrive at the ornament sale as close to 10am as possible to ensure a good selection. Doors will open at 9:30am for those who like to arrive early, but the sale will not begin until 10am.

STARworks is a project of Central Park NC, a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the economy of the region by focusing on the sustainable use of our natural and cultural resources. Proceeds from the ornament sale help fund STARworks programs, including the high school glassblowing program.

STARworks is located on Russell Drive in Star, just off I-73/74 in northern Montgomery County.

Paul holds an MFA from New York University and a BFA from the North Carolina School of the Arts. He has had the privilege of instructing students as a guest artist at New York University and the North Carolina School of the Arts. From 2003-2006, he held a faculty position at Carnegie Mellon University.

He currently lives in New York City and works across the globe. The exhibit will feature 16 costumes from various productions, including *Hamilton* and *The Wiz*, among others, along with many original costume design renderings.

The Upstairs Gallery will host works by Barbara Tazewell. Barbara lived in Akron, OH, before moving to Asheville, NC, where she now resides with her partner, Emma. She has four grown children, seven grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. She is a graduate of Bennett College in Greensboro, NC, and of Case Western-Reserve University in Cleveland, OH. She spent a year at the Université de Bordeaux in France as a Fulbright Fellow.

As an educator for many years, she taught English and French, and also worked as a media specialist. She has always been interested in children's literature, with a strong attraction for book illustrations. Her love of children's books led her to write and illustrate her own books.

Ola, the Water Bearer was originally created as a "flip book" located under the African Pavilion of the North Carolina Zoo. She has also illustrated the Christmas story, *JAIY*, incorporating the words of the

Gullah Bible. In many of her illustrations she uses the medium of collage of cut-outs of colored paper, origami paper, or fabric printed on paper to form pictures. She also works with fabrics, watercolor and inks.

Barbara has a love of traveling and experiencing new places, and the illustrations she created for *Jelly Bread and Water Juice*, written by her daughter-in-law, Lora Tazewell, reflect her travels to Jamaica. As an artist, she strives to see and to present the beauty of the world in a manner that may encourage others to see life around them in new and exciting ways.

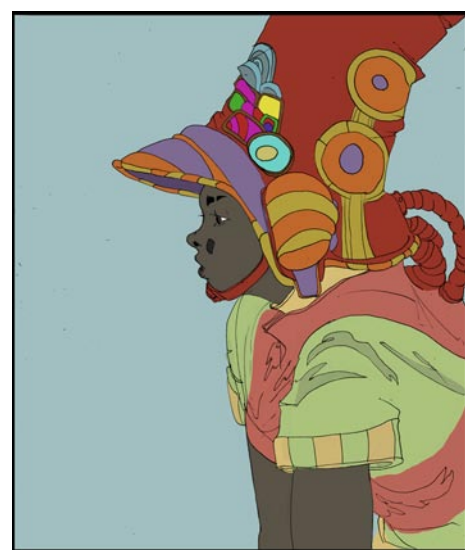
