Crafts, decorative items, mixed media artwork, and more will be featured from several Native American tribal groups.

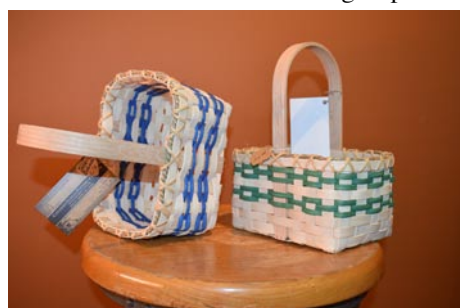
