Columbia College in Columbia, SC, Features Works by Michael Webster and Grey Eckert

Columbia College in Columbia, SC, will present two exhibitions including: *PULSE*, *Reaction*, featuring works by Michael Webster, on view in the Goodall Gallery, from Jan. 8 through Feb. 27, 2025, and you told me once but i forgot, featuring works by Grey Eckert, on view in the Loft Gallery, from Jan. 2 through Feb. 28, 2025. A reception will be held on Jan. 23, from 6-8pm, for both exhibits.

Michael Webster offers the following Artist Statement, "Through projects that span sculpture, installation, and lens-based media, I respond to the becomings and undoings of space. My work begins with a social conception of space, where shifting territorial boundaries form strata between people. I seek moments where boundaries become permeable - a place where architecture dissolves into raw matter or the surveyor's tools encode a digital artifact. By finding residues where systems are revealed, I question the processes of demarcation and displacement that inscribe sites of contention on the land."

"My practice is responsive at its core. Rather than invent new images, I recontextualize things already in circulation or develop site-specific, participatory projects," adds Webster. "Sometimes I will live with an object for a decade before I can meet it on its own terms. This responsiveness acknowledges social and material agency outside of myself and ultimately makes my practice a symbiotic one. Other people and other things offer many insights about living in fractured geographies. Their faint echoes reverberate through every space, carrying layered histories to anyone willing to listen. I work in the amplification of echoes."

Webster responds to the social organization of space through site-specific projects, sculpture, and lens-based media. His work is context-driven and materially attuned, investigating the effects of power on social geography with a focus on longterm participatory projects rooted in the southern United States. He has attended residencies at the McColl Center, ChaNorth, Hambidge Center for Creative Arts and Sciences, Elsewhere Living Museum,

and Penland School of Craft. He was the runner-up for the 2023 SouthArts Southern Prize and was selected as the South Carolina State Fellow.

Webster's exhibitions include the Ohr-O'Keefe Museum, the Czong Institute of Contemporary Art, Locust Projects, and the LIVLAB Watershed Space at Western Carolina University. He received a Bachelor of Fine Arts from East Carolina University and a Master of Fine Arts from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. Currently, he is a member of Tiger Strikes Asteroid GVL and an Assistant Professor at Wofford College in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

Grey Eckert offered the following Artist Statement about the exhibit, you told me once but i forgot, on view in the Loft Gallery, "you told me once but i forgot involves a stereotypically feminine artform: appropriated cross stitching, pre-existing ephemera that are, even still, entrenched within gendered ideologies. Subtracting specific textual elements from their surface transforms lyrical clichés into abbreviated utterances - expressions which articulate trauma consequent of the artist's gender and feminine experience. This series, furthermore, elevates its materials, long-scorned 'handicrafts' that possess domestic associations and are, thus, demeaned alike their makers: women whose work, free of socially-acceptable cadence, states what may otherwise go unsaid."

Nellie Grey Eckert (she/her) was born in Durham, NC, where she spent her childhood convincing others to call her by her middle name. After graduating from Coastal Carolina University with dual-BAs and academic minors in studio art, graphic design, art history, and photography, Eckert attended the University of South Carolina, where she earned an MFA in studio art. She currently teaches at Coastal Carolina University. Her fiber-based work investigates the chronic disdain that stereotypically feminine interests - 'craft' art, love stories, and Taylor Swift - face.
