“Diva” series; Fe de la Torre – large, colorful oil vignettes of memorable moments with family and friends; Barbara Eure – compassionate clay stylizations conveying love, strength, knowledge, pride and joy; Mary Gunyuzlu – whimsical, detailed animal sculptures that instantly bring smiles; Franklyn Millman – exquisite photographic portraits of wild horses from Iceland to the Outer Banks; Deborah Petermann – elegant paintings and drawings of fields, farms and forests from North Carolina to Neuchatel; Cheryl Powell – small, subtle and bold city scenes created as oil studies for larger works; Kathy Pruett – colorful acrylic-and-collage effusions of exuberant flowers and vases; and C.S. Young Jr. – dramatic black-and-white photographs of the iconic Oregon coast.

Associated Artists of Winston-Salem (AAWS) is a non-profit, membership-based organization supporting artists of all levels by offering opportunities to learn and grow creatively, and to exhibit and sell their art. Founded in 1956, AAWS offers the public opportunities to view and purchase art at more than 100 exhibitions in and around Winston-Salem each year. 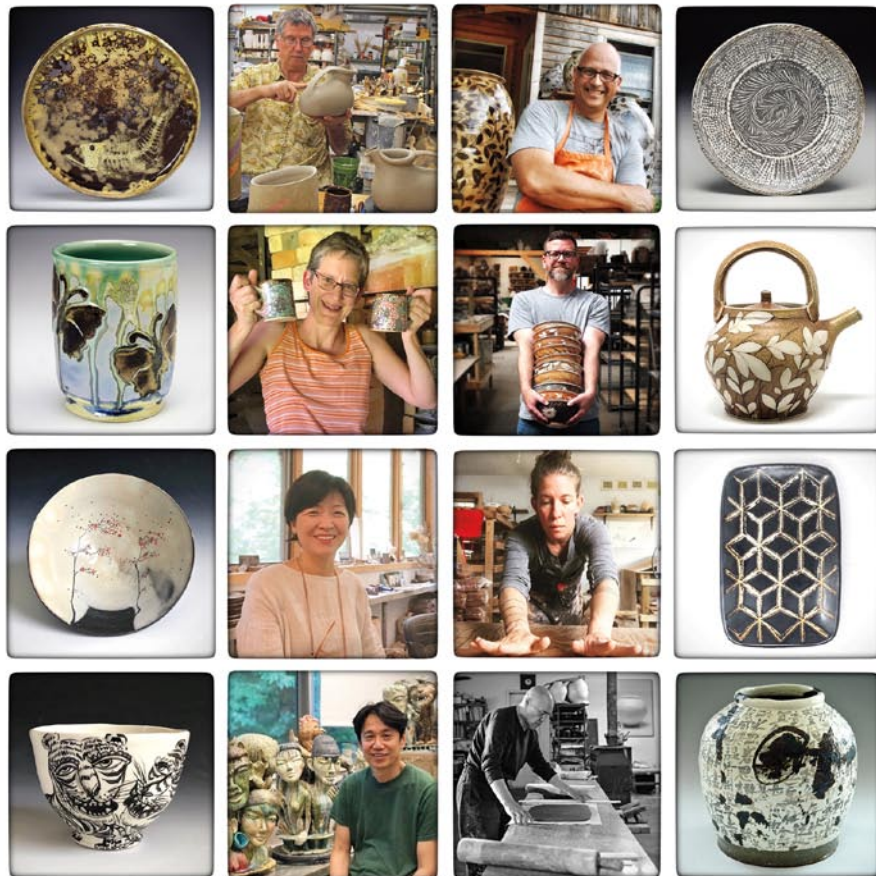
