grade. She earned a BFA in illustration from Syracuse University. However, her career path took a different turn when she taught art to children with disabilities.

After earning master's and doctoral degrees in special education from the University of Virginia, Elksnin came to The Citadel in 1984 to coordinate the special education graduate program. She retired as Professor Emerita in 2006 and returned to painting full time.

Elksnin's work has been shown throughout the southeast in galleries and at juried outdoor art shows. She'll have prints and paintings for sale.

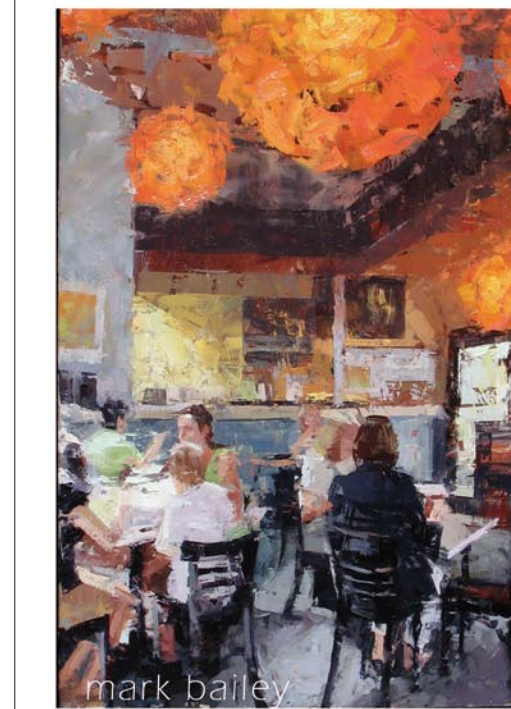
The exhibit features an extensive sampling of photographs selected from the Photography Club's video and book entitled *Johns Island: A Moment in Time*.

Karen's Korner Frame and Art Gallery in Mount Pleasant, SC, will present the exhibit, *Fired Up With Liv and Keller*, featuring works by Lee, a glass fusion artist, and Antonecchia, a ceramic artist, on view from Apr. 18 through May 3, 2012. A reception will be held on Apr. 18, from 6-8pm.

The exhibition will showcase current and new work that explores kiln fired arts both functional and decorative.

Owner and operator of Terra Locale Ceramic Studio, Liv Antonecchia will showcase new surface techniques in her body of work including block printing and etching directly into the clay. Functional stoneware works include jars, bowls and tumblers as well as decorative pieces

for the wall. Keller Lee, owner of Warm Glass by Keller will showcase spring-inspired functional and decorative plates as well as decorative ornaments for the home and garden.

A graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University and a major in Material Studies/Craft, Antonecchia studied both glass and ceramics. To further her education in the fine craft field she worked in several galleries and studios along the east coast. With the purchase of a house in 2001 Antonecchia took the opportunity to set up her own studio and focus on functional stoneware pottery. Today she sells her pottery at Karen's Korner on an ongoing basis as well as Charleston Crafts Cooperative, Magnolia Gardens, Middleton Plantation and Charleston Tea Garden's.

A native to the Palmetto State, Keller Lee grew up in Florence, SC. In 1996 after moving to Charleston he began studying and taking classes in glass fusion. In 2010 Keller was awarded the Lowcountry Quarterly Arts Grant for his solo show *Inspirations in Glass*. Today his work can be found at Karen's Korner, Charleston Stained Glass, The City of North Charleston Art Gallery Gift Shop and the
