A reception will be held on July 14, from 5:30-8pm at both locations.

photographers of all ages from Darlington County, SC, will be on display showing imagery of "The Carolinas", with the exclusion of the "International Eye" category, which will feature scenes from around the world.

"We've adjusted the criteria for the Darlington County Travelers category from last year. This category is for photos taken abroad only," said Carolyn Atkinson, President of BCAC. "There are so many people who want to share the images from their travels. Black Creek and the Library are going to give them that opportunity."

The mission of Black Creek Arts Council is to promote and foster the Arts in Darlington County. BCAC's offices are housed in a state of the art 10,000 square foot facility at 116 West College Avenue in Hartsville, SC. BCAC offers a variety of programs including art classes of all styles, after-school activities, pre-school aged programs, private music lessons, and various types of gallery exhibits. BCAC also offers assistance with arts management, funding, education, and program coordination to

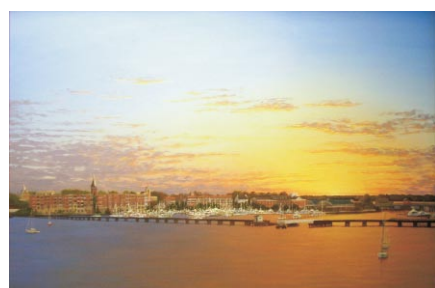
arts and cultural organizations in Darlington County.

The purpose of the Friends of Hartsville Memorial Library is to lead in the development of programs for the extension and improvement of the library services and resources; to encourage community support for the necessary development of the library to the end that it may serve adequately the needs of the population of Hartsville. Currently, the Hartsville library is the crown jewel of branches in the county library system with its 20,000 sq. ft. facility offering books, magazines, audio books, DVDs, computers, children's, teen and adult programming, and meeting rooms.

The Darlington County Photography Club is a club whose focus is on fellowship between photographers of all levels in the Darlington County and surrounding areas. We meet monthly to discuss certain skills, techniques and philosophies. 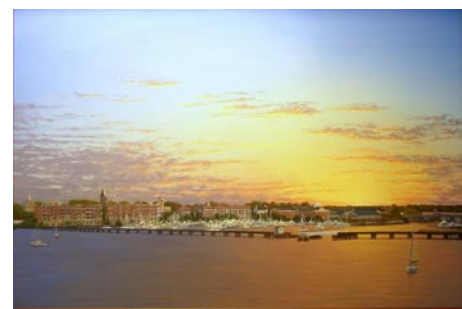


New Bern 2011 - oil - T Rader

Carolina Creations Fine Art and Contemporary Craft Gallery in New Bern, NC, will present an exhibit of works by T Rader, aka Tim Hergenrader, and Janet Francoeur, on view from July 1 through Aug. 31, 2011. A reception will be held on July 8, from 5-8pm, in conjunction with the New Bern Art Walk.

Hergenrader is a native Nebraskan who found it increasingly difficult to paint seascapes from the Great Plains, so, he quit his "regular" job, packed up his belongings and moved to New Bern.

After more than 14 years' service as Public Information Officer for the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency, Hergenrader put down his red pencil on March 31, 2004, and stepped into retirement.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, he is primarily self-taught, although he has taken art classes at several community colleges. Hergenrader works exclusively in oils, because, he says, "I like the smell and feel of them."

Hergenrader is particularly fond of birds and began his career painting waterfowl. Since moving to New Bern his primary focus has been painting seascapes, waterways and the New Bern skyline.

Janet Francoeur has a BA in drawing and printmaking from Siena Heights University in Adrian, MI, and has lived in New Bern since 1989.

Francoeur spent 20 years working in ink doing architectural renderings. Once she and her husband Michael moved to New Bern she was inspired by the breathtaking beauty of spring in New Bern and she began to add color to her ink drawings. Soon after she began adding oils, acrylics and even clay to her repertoire.

Francoeur regularly works in each of the mediums and for this show you will see acrylic and watercolor paintings depicting regional architecture and gardens.

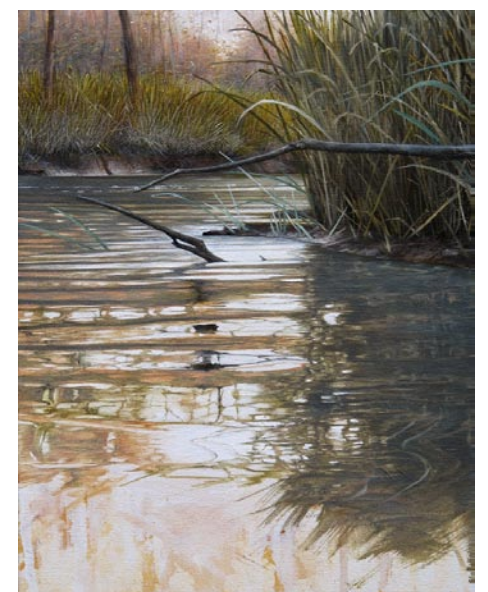

The Cheryl Newby Gallery in Pawleys Island, SC, Features Works by Charles Williams

An exhibition of fifteen paintings by Charles Williams is on view at The Cheryl Newby Gallery in Pawleys Island, SC, through July 16, 2011. This one-man show, *Southern Exposure - Paintings by Charles Williams*, will introduce Williams as the most recent artist to join the gallery.

A 2006 graduate of Savannah College of Art and Design, in 2009 Williams joined a very select group of artists from across America when he was awarded a Hudson River Fellowship to study at The Grand Central Academy of Art in New York. There he received instruction and mentoring from highly regarded contemporary realist painters Jacob Collins and Edward Minoff among others. His paintings have been exhibited in Tampa, Atlanta, and Charleston, SC, where he resides.

Williams grew up in coastal Georgetown County, SC, and from an early age felt an intense reverence for the natural beauty of the land and waterways. He now paints full time and is known to declare that he "loves, lives, and breathes art".
