Since 1948, the Craft Fair of the Southern Highlands has showcased work by members of the Southern Highland Craft Guild, (SHCG) a non-profit organization dedicated to keeping crafts alive and relevant in modern times. Having been accepted into the Guild through a rigorous jury process, the artists at the fair represent the finest in the Appalachian region. Membership to the SHCG is open to craftspeople, makers, and artists living in the mountain counties of nine states from Maryland to Alabama. To apply online and learn more, visit (craftguild.org/join). E-mail (mentoring@craftguild.org) to register for a Mentoring Workshop to prepare for the jury process. For the first time in the history of the SHCG, applicants can purchase a booth to sell and have their work juried at the fair.
